ENGAGING Your RABBI

We at OU Kashrut urge our readers to personally engage their Rabbi. Why? Why don't we simply offer our recommendations? Because that is not how *halacha* works—especially not on Pesach, when individual communities have widely varying standards and customs. In part, Pesach is a celebration of the diversity that exists and flourishes in Torah-observant life: the variety of customs and traditions all reflect Hashem's word and intent.

The Torah is made up of the written law (Torah she-bi-ktav) and our oral tradition (Torah she-be'al peh), which creates the flexibility to respond to changing circumstances and communal norms. Part of the OU's mandate is to serve the entire Jewish community. Therefore, some of the questions we receive have more than one answer, each of which is correct for a different community or situation. As the world's largest and most comprehensive kashrut agency, the OU can offer first-hand information about what happens in food manufacturing, serving as a resource for local rabbinic leaders. However, the application of halacha in our lives is not a cold and impersonal process, not the sum total of scientific or even halachic

information.

Many issues that arise regarding kashrut on Pesach are clear cut and have universally-accepted answers. In such cases, we do not hesitate to offer our recommendations. In other cases there may be differing opinions amongst contemporary poskim, especially when it comes to different *minhagim* (customs). The OU can declare that a product is made from corn or other *kitniyot* (legumes). We cannot, however, decide what your individual or communal attitude towards kitniyot should be. This depends on where your family comes from and other communal norms, and falls squarely within the domain of a communal or personal Rav (Rabbi).

Likewise, the decision whether newly-commercialized products such as quinoa (see article on page 16) are considered kitniyot, or whether you should or should not use peanut oil, is beyond our mandate. We strongly urge individuals to familiarize themselves with their family traditions and communal norms. Above all else, we urge you to *aseh l'cha Rav*, develop a relationship with a rabbi familiar with your situation, your community's expectations and with the *halacha* in general. ■

SHOPPING FOR Pesach

When "Kosher" is -
or isn't -
"Kosher for Pesach"



Shopping for Pesach can be rather complicated. Although year-round products shouldn't be assumed kosher unless there is a genuine kashrut symbol on the package, we usually know exactly where on the package to look and what to expect. When shopping for Pesach, however, we have to be all the more careful that everything we are buying is really "Kosher for Pesach".

In general, the OU's policy is that the packaging of all certified products must bear the OU-P (OU Passover/Pesach), and that there must be a Kasher LePesach ingredients list. However, in Israel this system is less common. The general rule in Israel is: if it says anywhere on the packaging Kosher for Pesach/Passover, the product is considered Kasher LePesach according to all the certifying bodies whose imprints appear on

the package. If any of the supervising agencies that oversee the product for year-round use do not want to certify the product for Passover, they must write an explicit disclaimer that their certification is for regular year-round use only – and not for Pesach. Additionally, because printing costs are higher in Israel and products are often produced by smaller companies, many Israeli kashrut agencies will allow a "Kasher LePesach" sticker to be added to regular year-round packaging. While such a label may be valid, it never hurts to check with the certifying kashrut agency. Always remember: whether for Pesach or even regular year-round kashrut – if a kosher symbol doesn't seem genuine for whatever reason, check with the kashrut organization to verify the product's kosher status. ■

STAYING Mehadrin

*Why is this Hechsher Different
from All Other Hechsherim?*

We receive many inquiries regarding products that are certified by various kashrut authorities, yet for Pesach certification is given solely by the OU. Why is the OU willing to certify these products for Pesach when the other certifying agencies are not?

The answer to this question is actually quite simple: Many of the kashrut authorities in Eretz Yisrael, like the communities they represent, have distinct minhagim for Pesach. A common minhag is that they do not, as a rule, certify products that contain more than four or five ingredients. Furthermore, only products that are deemed necessities are certified. These kashrut organizations see no reason to take responsibility for Pesach items that are not essential, and people in these communi-

ties generally forego use of non-essential products for the week of Pesach.

The policy of the OU is to certify these items, if, and only if, all the raw materials are determined to be Mehadrin.

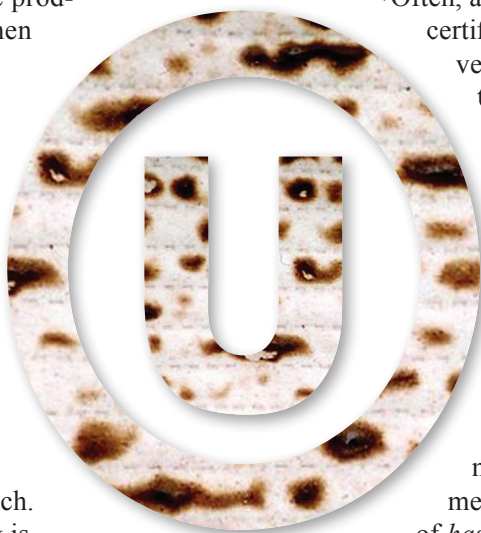
(Often, all the ingredients are certified Mehadrin by the very kashrut organizations that are unwilling to give the end-product Mehadrin certification for Pesach.)

As a matter of policy, the OU is strict regarding the level of supervision required for special production runs for Pesach products. In

most cases, our requirement for extra high levels of *hashgacha* (supervision)

on Pesach production-runs usually entails *Hashgacha Temidit* in all factories producing for Pesach.

In short, the OU Kashrut Staff feel very comfortable telling Am Yisrael that they can expect the highest "Mehadrin" standards in our Pesach products, just as they can year-round. ■

MOTZI MATZA

Shmura, Eighteen Minute, Hand-Made or Machine: What's What?

One of the least understood issues in Pesach kashrut is the distinction between the different types of matzot. Do I eat only shmura, eighteen minutes shmura, regular eighteen minute matza, hand-made matza, *Reichaim Shel Yad*, or plain and simple Kosher L'Pesach matza? Is there really a difference? After all, if it says Kosher L'Pesach, isn't it Kosher L'Pesach? The answers to the two latter questions are both YES: There are differences between the various types of matzot, and they are all Kosher L'Pesach.

WHY SHMURA?

The Torah tells us that we may not eat or even own any leavened bread during Pesach; however, the parameters of "bread" are not specifically outlined in the Torah. Our Sages teach us that matza must be created in a process that takes no more than 18 minutes from the moment flour and water come into contact until the process is completed. Therefore, all matzot that are Kosher for Passover must meet this criterion. However, the Torah tells us, specifically regarding the matzot that are eaten seder night, that we should 'guard' the matzot: "ושמרתם את המצות". We are commanded to watch and guard the matzot so as to be certain that they do not become *chametz* (that is, by not

allowing more than 18 minutes to pass from the time the flour and water come into contact). By commanding us to do something obvious – to watch or guard the matzot – the Torah appears to be using unnecessary, even redundant wording. Chazal therefore understand this commandment to be an additional obligation, specific to the *matzot mitzva* eaten at the seder. While we may eat no chametz throughout the seven-day holiday, we are specifically obligated to eat matzot on the seder night. The unusual, seemingly redundant wording of the verse ושמרתם את המצות is understood as an additional stringency for the matzot used to fulfill our obligation to eat matza at the seder; from this "extra" שמירה comes the concept of *matza shmura*.

The clear implication is that for matzot to be considered "shmura" there must be something "excessive" – above and beyond the guarding of the flour – involved in their production. It follows that non-shmura matzot can be 100% kosher. If only shmura matza were kosher, by definition there would be nothing unusual or excessive about it or the process through which it was created or guarded – hence it would be regular matza. What sets shmura

matza apart from "regular" matza? Even non-shmura matzot have an *extra shmira*. Rather than simply supervising the process of turning flour and water into matzot in less than 18 minutes, most matzot are made from flour that is Shmura *miSh'at Techina* – supervised or guarded from the time it is ground. According to many authorities, this level of supervision is sufficient for the matzot to be considered having an extra shmira. However, shmura matza is made from flour that is supervised from an even earlier stage – *Shmura miSh'at Ketzira* (from the harvesting of the grains). In both cases, the shemira is

only halachically significant if it is done with express intention to prepare it for use as *matzat mitzva* (and not, for example, to meet government requirements or to prevent theft).

On the other hand, because the whole idea of having matza shmura stems from this idea of extraordinary measures regarding matzot mitzva used at the seder, one only need use shmura matza for the seder. However, with regard to Pesach in particular, there are all sorts of minhagim (customs) that involve taking on extra chumrot; using only matza shmura for the whole of Pesach is one such custom. Thus, there are those whose minhag is to use

shmura matza all through Pesach, and they should continue to do so. For those who do not have this tradition or custom, there is no need to take on this extra stringency.

There is, however, an additional reason why some people try to eat only matza shmura throughout Pesach: The Vilna Gaon was of the opinion

that eating matza all seven days of Pesach may be a mitzva, as it says in the verse "Seven days you shall eat matzot." If so, all matzot we eat for the whole of Pesach (in their recognizable form, and not in the form of matzo meal or cake meal) have

the status of matzot mitzva and should therefore also require the additional shmira we have discussed. Those who eat only shmura matza for this reason may use non-shmura matza products such as cake meal, matza meal, or cakes and rolls made from matza meal.

EIGHTEEN MINUTE MATZOT:

"Eighteen minute matza" is a term used to describe machine-made matza production during which the equipment is stopped, partially disassembled and cleaned every eighteen minutes, rather than after an eight hour shift (or some other set interval).

Regular machine-made matza production does not include this 18-minute cleaning requirement, for several reasons: The concern that small bits of dough may adhere to

the sides of the machinery is dismissed, because the machines that produce the matzot are in constant motion and all the dough is mixed constantly. There is consequently no risk of any chametz coming into existence.

Two additional factors further reduce any possible concern. First, the minute deposits of dough that get stuck on the side of the machines (in little nooks and crannies) and

get remixed into the matzot constitute a halachically insignificant percentage of the dough (this minute quantity is batel, meaning nullified or considered non-existent). Secondly, the machines are cleaned every few minutes, either with air guns or vacuum cleaners. While that cleaning process is not perfect

(the equipment remains in operation, with a steady flow of matza production), it nevertheless provides yet another safeguard against the possibility of chametz.

HAND MATZA:

According to many halachic authorities, it is important that the matzot being used to fulfill the mitzva should be made expressly for this purpose. When matzot are made by hand, it is much easier to insure that the matzot are made for the fulfillment of the mitzva: At the beginning of a matza-baking shift, all the workers declare explicitly that all the work they do that day is "leshem matzot mitzva" – for the sake of the mitzva of matzot. While the same declaration could be made regarding the workers who con-

trol the production line of machine-made matza, it is a matter of contention as to whether or not this is effective, as they are not actively making the matzot but merely monitoring the machines.

As a result, many people shy away from using machine matzot for the seder.

This being said, there are those who prefer machine matzot over hand matzot, even for the seder. While hand-made matzot may be considered more mehudar because of the intent with which they were made, they cannot compete with the precision of machine-made matzot. When dealing with issues of chametz,



every bit of precision counts. However, because many people have very particular minhagim regarding what they eat on Pesach, there are conse-

quently people who will not use machine matzot, no matter how mehudar they are, because their ancestors did not use such matzot.

Within the various categories of matza we have discussed, there is still a great deal of room for hidurim, whether the

matzot are produced by machine or by hand. Consequently, there are, in fact, real differences between the brands and hashgachot. ■



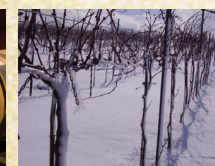

WHAT TO EXPECT From OU Matzot

ALL MACHINE MATZOT:

◆ As an extra stringency, the OU requires that during machine production of Matza under our supervision, all the rollers and belts are cleaned (not dismantled) with a vacuum or air gun every 3 minutes.

◆ We are very particular that at the end of every shift (every 18 minutes for 18 Minute Matzot), all nooks and crannies of the machines are thoroughly cleaned.

◆ We kasher the ovens used to produce Kosher L'Pesach matza with Libbun Gammur (ultra-high heating that turns metal white-hot). All plastic and rubber parts are changed and Teflon

parts are either recoated or changed before the Pesach production-run (the same holds true for the hachshara between production of egg matza and regular matza.

◆ We pay special attention to all parts of the

production line that lead to the oven (including the Pi HaTanur), to make sure that they stay cool. This involves special air-conditioning and ventilation techniques.

ALL HAND MATZOT:

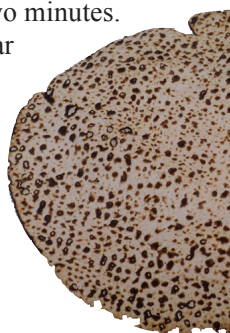
◆ We require that the paper sheets covering the 'reidlers' tables are changed approximately every two minutes.

◆ We are very particular that the sleeves (of workers' clothing) stay rolled up so as to avoid clothing coming into contact with the dough or collecting crumbs that may fall back into the dough.

◆ The ovens used to produce matzot under our supervision are outfitted with special lights that enable us to monitor the matzot throughout the baking process.

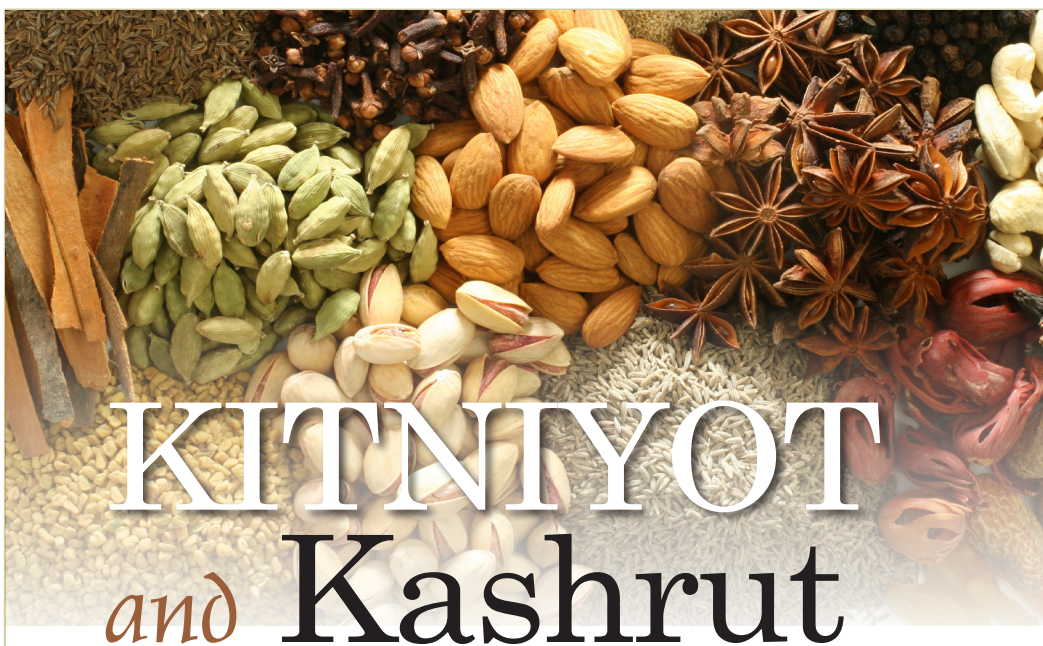
ALL MATZOT:

◆ Aside from the team of excellent mashgichim in every matza bakery, one of our in-house OU Rabbanim visits each of the matza bakeries under our supervision weekly. ■



Traveling at the Speed of *Hertz*

Pesach is a special yom tov that turns a spotlight on different kashrut-related subjects, some of which are exclusive to this seven-day period. Additionally, Pesach, to a large degree, centers on family *minhagim*. This article will examine one of Pesach's more common family kashrut *minhagim*, *kitniyot*.

Kitniyot as a category encompasses certain grains, legumes, or vegetables Ashkenazi Jews have a tradition not to eat during Pesach even though they are not- nor can they become - *chametz*. This custom is not generally followed by Sephardic Jews, whose tradition has been to eat *kitniyot* during Pesach. The precise source of the *minhag* is not exactly clear, although it is referred to in writings of Rishonim. There are two primary rationales attributed to

this *minhag*. The first refers to the harvesting process: the grains and legumes in this category were grown or stored in proximity to wheat, which may inadvertently become mixed in and become *chametz* during baking or cooking. Alternatively, it is argued that the legumes and grains in this category were prohibited for Pesach

use because they can be ground and used as a substitute for wheat flour, which might lead ignorant individuals to become confused and erroneously assume that wheat flour is permissible on Pesach.

The parameters of this *minhag* are not always clear. For example, halachic authorities are in disagreement regarding the application of the ban on *kitniyot* to peanuts, cottonseed, quinoa, as well as oils produced from legumes in general. Furthermore, some

earlier sources broadened this minhag to include coffee and tea. In addition, Rav Shlomo Zalman Auerbach zt'l is quoted as maintaining that the minhag of *kitniyot* may also include potato starch, since its use and appearance meet the above criteria. Divergences of opinion notwithstanding, this minhag should be taken seriously. The Maharil is quoted as stating that anyone who dismisses the minhag of *kitniyot* is also in violation of the Torah prohibition of *lo tasur*. When in doubt, individuals should follow their family traditions. In the absence of a longstanding family custom, a rabbi should be consulted.

The *minhag* of *kitniyot* is a stringency, a *chumra*, which means that unlike *chametz*, *kitniyot* are essentially permissible. Hence, one may store *kitniyot* during Pesach and even derive benefit from them. The *Terumat HaDeshen* discussed the use of *kitniyot* as a source of fuel during Pesach and ruled that it was permissible. In his *teshuva*, the *Terumat HaDeshen* supported this position by citing the two reasons above for the minhag of *kitniyot*, and explained that because *kitniyot* is essentially permissible it is clearly not subject to the same stringencies as *chametz*. Therefore, the *Terumat HaDeshen* wrote, *kitniyot* may be kept in one's home and even utilized for non-food purposes.

Since, strictly speaking, *kitniyot* is es-

entially permissible, should it fall into a food, even during Pesach, it will become batel (nullified) in a mostly non-*kitniyot* mixture. As a result, the food will be permitted and the utensils will not be affected. This halacha has an important application in the unfortunately not-so-uncommon situation when a mistake is made while cooking in preparation for Pesach. If an ingredient that is not certified Kasher L'Pesach is used by mistake, does not contain *chametz*, but does contain a *kitniyot* component - the

kitchen will not become treif. One example of this kind of situation is someone who used mayonnaise not certified Kasher L'Pesach to make a dish for the holiday. Mayonnaise does not contain obvious *chametz* but does contain *kitniyot* ingredients, such as vinegar (in the United States, vinegar is assumed to be corn-derived). In Israel, vinegar is assumed to be citrus-derived. Footnote? The food will actually be permissible to eat during Pesach, although most people would understandably opt not to do so. Regardless, there is no need to go into crisis mode. If this kind of unfortunate event should occur in your kitchen, consult your rabbi, but feel free to relax and call him calmly.

During a food shortage, the Chatam Sofer addressed a pressing sheilah regarding the use of certain grains for matzot mitzvah. In his response, the Chatam Sofer assumed that in extenuating cir-

cumstances, such as times of famine or other difficulty, a poor person may eat *kitniyot* for basic nourishment. Similarly, the Aruch HaShulchan also writes that since *kitniyot* is a minhag, in the pressing situation of a food shortage, *kitniyot* may be eaten during Pesach.

There is a tradition that gedolei Yisrael at the turn of the 20th century dealt with a comparable sheilah, when there were major food shortages before and during Pesach.

In response, Rav Chaim Brisker zt'l maintained that a stringent position was incorrect; in support of his opinion he cited Hilchot Mamrim, where the Rambam writes that one who halachically treats issurei derabbanan (rabbinic prohibitions) with the same stringency as issurei deoraita (Torah prohibitions) is in violation of *bal tosif* (the Torah prohibition to add to the Torah). Rav Chaim argued that treating a minhag with a level of stringency beyond what halacha requires is in conflict with the Rambam's position.

There are unfortunate situations when sick people are instructed by a doctor to use healthcare or nutritional products for basic sustenance during Pesach (please read our Medicine Guidelines, p. 34, for more on this topic). Thankfully, we live in a time when many of these types of products are certified *kosher* throughout the year. However, most, if not all, are not certified as *Kosher L'Pesach*, for two main reasons. Firstly, the large nutri-

tional companies do not see the value of an already-limited *kosher* market that is further limited to roughly one week of the year. Secondly, many of these products do not qualify for Pesach certification, since they often contain *chametz*,

kitniyot, or an integral component whose Pesach status is too difficult to ascertain. If a doctor instructs someone to use a healthcare or nutritional product, a source that is under year-round *kosher* certification should be obtained. Since the product is under *kosher* certification, the certifying

agency or hashgacha can advise whether the product should be assumed to contain *chametz* or *kitniyot*. If the product is only assumed to contain *kitniyot*, even if the situation is not necessarily one of pikuach nefesh (life-threatening), exceptions can be made under extenuating circumstances. Unquestionably, a rabbi must be consulted first to decide whether the situation warrants use of the product during Pesach. Ideally, the rabbi should also speak to the *kosher* agency or hashgacha directly to obtain all the necessary information.

While we celebrate Pesach this year and reflect on Redemption from Egypt, we should also think about our rich family traditions. The steadfast observance of Torah, including minhagim, is what makes us an Am Kadosh, a Holy Nation, and preserves our special identity throughout the generations. ■

COCOA

No Beans About it

Ashkenazic custom does not allow eating kitniyot (legumes) on Pesach. Included in this category are rice, corn and all types of beans. So why are we permitted to eat chocolate on Passover? Isn't chocolate derived from the cocoa bean?

Although they are referred to as beans, cocoa beans are not legumes at all. They are the edible seeds of the cocoa fruit, which grows on a cocoa tree (Theobroma cacao). To better understand why this is significant, we should remind ourselves why legumes were forbidden. Historically, legumes were

grown next to fields of grain. The five species of grain (wheat, barley, spelt, rye and oats), which can become chametz, would get mixed up among the beans. Additionally, because beans are used to make breads and porridges in a manner similar to the five grains, using kitniyot on Pesach can lead to confusion.

These reasons do not apply to chocolate. Cocoa is not used in a manner similar to flour, nor is it grown, collected or stored in a way that would allow grains to get mixed in. Because cocoa is actually a fruit and not a bean, the restrictions of kitniyot do not apply. However, this does lead to an interesting discussion in rabbinic literature as to the correct blessing for chocolate: Why recite a shehakol on chocolate and not a borei pri ha'eitz? (See Minchat Shlomo I:91). ■

KASHERING

for An Overview of PESACH Materials and Methods

One of the many preparations one must make for Pesach is kashering, a process to prepare chametz utensils for Pesach use. (Although most people only kasher their utensils in preparation for Pesach, the following directions apply to *kashering* all year-round as well.) As with all areas of *halachah*, those who are unsure of how to apply the rules of *kashering* to their situation should consult their local Orthodox rabbi.

GENERAL RULES

There are two steps in kashering:

1. Cleaning-removing all tangible traces of chametz, and
2. Purging-using heat to remove all absorbed chametz flavor.

CLEANING

All chametz utensils that will be used for Pesach must first be thoroughly cleaned.

This involves the removal of all food, rust, dirt, calcium deposits and anything else that protrudes; it does not include the removal of discolorations. Items which have narrow cracks, crevices, deep scratches or other areas that cannot easily be cleaned, cannot be kashered for Pesach. Therefore, the following, for example, cannot be kashered: Colanders; decanters or baby bottles (due to their narrow necks); filters/screens over drains in sinks; graters; knives (or other utensils) where food or dirt can get trapped between the blade and handle; slotted spoons; sponges; toothbrushes.

Additionally, the common custom is to cover tables, counters, refrigerator shelves and other areas where one might not have been able to clean away every trace of chametz.

PURGING

In addition to cleaning, most items require some form of hot purging in order to remove the flavor that has been absorbed. As a rule, any utensil that came in contact with hot food, was washed with hot water or was used to store liquids, requires hot purging. A comprehensive analysis regarding when hot purging is required and how one determines which form of purging is effective is beyond the scope of this article. Rather we will describe the standard method of purging flavor from the most common items.

Utensils made from the following materials cannot be kashered: Ceramic—all types—including brick, china, coffee mugs and enamel; glass—all forms—including Corning Ware, Corelle, fiberglass, porcelain enamel (for example, porcelain sinks

and enamelized pots), Pyrex or Thermoses; plastic—Rabbinical authorities disagree as to whether it is possible to kasher plastic and other synthetic materials (including Teflon, rubber, Formica). You should consult your local rabbi. If a synthetic material is a minority component of a substance (like Silverstone), many rabbis believe that one may kasher it, even if one does not normally kasher artificial materials.

As a rule, materials such as fabric, metal, wood, rubber and stone (for example, granite and marble) can be kashered.

SPECIFIC ITEMS

All methods of kashering noted in this section presuppose that the equipment was thoroughly cleaned, as described above.

SILVERWARE, POTS & OTHER ITEMS

Small items are kashered with hag'alah, which involves three stages:

1. Not using the utensil for anything, including non-chametz use, for twenty-four hours. This also applies to the (non-Pesach) pot in which the hag'alah water will be boiled.
2. Submerging the utensil in boiling water that is over the fire. The water must be at a rolling boil before the utensil is put into it, and the water must touch every surface of the utensil. Therefore, each item should be kashered individually, and the water should be allowed to return to a boil before the next item is placed into the pot. Large utensils may be submerged in the water one part at a time.
3. Removing the utensil from the water and rinsing it in cold water.



OVENS

Kashering a Self-Cleaning Oven:

1. Remove any visible pieces of food (or other items) from the oven;
2. Go through one complete self cleaning cycle with the racks in place.

Kashering a Non-Self-Cleaning Oven:

1. Clean walls, floor, door, ceiling and racks thoroughly with an abrasive cleaner (for example, Easy-Off) to remove tangible chametz. Pay special attention to the temperature gauge, the window in the door and the edges of the oven chamber.

Black discolorations that are flush with the metal need not be removed.

2. Once the oven is clean, it is preferable that it remain unused for twenty-four hours.
3. Place the racks back into the oven, and turn the oven to broil for one and-a-half hours.
4. Pesach food or pans may be placed directly on the door or racks once the oven has been kashered.

If the oven has a separate broiler chamber, it should be kashered in the same manner as the oven chamber.

A broiler pan that comes in direct contact with food cannot be kashered.

Note: The method of kashering ovens described above is based on the ruling of Rav Aharon Kotler zt'l. However, Rav Moshe Feinstein ruled that the oven must either be kashered with a blowtorch, or that an insert should be placed into the oven for the duration of Pesach. Consult your own rabbi for guidance.

STOVETOPS

The grates of a gas stovetop should be kashered in the oven chamber in the same manner described above. For an electric stovetop, just clean the coils and turn on high for ten minutes. If you have a glass-topped stovetop, consult your rabbi for directions regarding the permissibility of use for Pesach or koshering methods. For a gas or electric stove, it is preferable to replace the drip pans that are under the burners; if this isn't possible, the area



should be covered with aluminum foil. The work area between the burners should be cleaned and covered with aluminum foil. The knobs and handles of the oven and stovetop should be wiped clean.

SINKS

Kashering a Stainless Steel Sink:

1. If the filter covering the drain has very fine holes, remove the filter and put it away for Pesach with the chametz dishes. If the holes are larger, the filter may be kashered with the sink.
2. Clean the sink, faucet and knobs, and don't use the sink for anything other than cold water for twenty-four hours.
3. Boil water in one or more large pots (clean pots that have not been used for

twenty-four hours). The pots may be chametz pots.

4. Dry the sink, then pour the boiling water over every spot on the walls and floor of the sink and on the faucet. One may kasher part of the sink and then boil more water for the rest of the sink. Extreme care should be taken during this type of kashering to ensure that none of the boiling water splashes onto the person doing the kashering or others who are nearby.
5. Rinse the sink and faucet with cold water.
6. Put a new filter over the drain. One should also purchase new sponges and a fresh bottle of dishwashing liquid.

Kosher Countertops

Get to Work on your Working Surface

Marble and granite countertops can be kashered for Pesach. This can be accomplished by thoroughly cleaning the countertop. After one is sure that the countertop is completely clean and free of all food residue and dirt the surface must not be used for a full 24 hours (it isn't a problem to leave objects on the surface during this period just hot pots and liquids shouldn't be placed on it). At the end of the 24 hour waiting period make sure that the surface is still dirt free and pour boiling water over the entire surface taking special care that all areas get covered by the boiling water. One may boil a second pot and so forth and Kasher the counter surface part by part. *Note:* special care should be taken that all joints of the countertop are cleaned thoroughly before Kashering. This can be accomplished by running a toothpick back and forth multiple times.

Even after koshering the countertops

the prevalent minhag is still to cover them as it is difficult to say for certain that the countertops are completely clean.

Caesar Marble (Shayish Caesar) looks and resembles real marble that it isn't. Caesar Marble is actually made from 90+% ground quartz crystals and 10% or less glue and dyes. The glue acts to solidify the quartz crystals into a solid mass and then the mass is placed in a low heat oven to dry into a marble-like substance. As such it would seem that this Caesar Marble is halachically porous and therefore cannot be Kashered. Therefore Caesar Marble should be cleaned and then covered (some opinions maintain that they should be covered with two or multiple layers).

Glass, wood, ceramic, and Formica countertops cannot be Kashered. Therefore they should be cleaned thoroughly and covered (some opinions maintain that they should be covered with two or multiple layers). ■

Kashering a Porcelain Sink:

Since a porcelain sink cannot be kashered, one should kasher the faucet and knobs as outlined above and, for the duration of Pesach, place a basin (or insert) into the sink. All dishes, silverware, etc., should be washed in the basin, and wash-water can be disposed of through the sink's drain. One should be careful not to allow the sink to fill with hot water while the basin is in the sink.

REFRIGERATORS, FREEZERS, FOOD SHELVES AND PANTRIES

These areas should be thoroughly cleaned

paying special attention to the edges where crumbs may get trapped and the shelves lined with paper or plastic. The refrigerator and freezer will operate more efficiently if one pokes a few holes in the lining.

TABLECLOTHS, KITCHEN GLOVES, APRONS & OTHER FABRICS

Any item made of fabric can be kashered by washing it in a washing machine set on 'hot' and then checking to make sure that no pieces of food remain attached to it. Vinyl and plastic-lined tablecloths cannot be kashered. ■

Medicine Guidelines

1 Always exercise extreme caution and consult with your doctor and rabbi before making a decision not to take a medicine.

2 Known and tested medications in the form of creams, non-chewable pills and injections may be owned, used and consumed on Pesach, even if they contain chametz or kitniyot, because they are inedible. This covers most medicines used by adults.

If an equally effective chametz-free alternative is available or procurable, ask your doctor or pharmacist to replace your medication with the chametz-free alternative.

It is permissible to grind pills and mix the powder into food items so that a child can take medicine on Pesach; this does not render the medication “edible” and would therefore not alter the ruling regarding Passover use. However, a doctor must be consulted to make sure that the child is getting the correct dosage and that the potency of the pill is not compromised by altering its consistency.

3 Liquid medicines, chewable pills and pills coated with a flavored glaze may contain chametz. Because these are palatable, “edible” items, they may be problematic on Pesach. Gelcaps may also present a problem because they may con-

tain non-kosher edible gelatin. Therefore:

a. If possible, they should be replaced — under the direction of a doctor — with a nonchewable, uncoated pill.

b. If substitution is not possible and the person is in a state of sakanah or safek sakanah (any possible danger to human life), the medication may be owned and consumed.

The same applies if the condition is not yet a safek sakanah but may deteriorate

to that point. (A rabbi should be consulted as to whether it is preferable to purchase

the medicine before or during Pesach, and as to how to dispose of the medicine during Pesach once the danger passes.)

c. If substitution is not possible and a doctor determines that there is no possibil-

ity of sakanah if the person does not take the medicine, a rabbi should be consulted. He may be able to determine that the medicine does not contain chametz or kitniyot, or he may decide that the medicine may be consumed due to the seriousness of the patient’s condition.

4 In many cases, medicinal items containing kitniyot are permitted for people who are ill. Specific questions on this issue should be directed to your rabbi.

5 These guidelines do not address the more general prohibition of consuming medicines on Shabbat and Yom Tov. ■

TIPS FOR PESACH PREPARATION

Last year, a week or so before Pesach, my wife received a greeting card from a friend of hers. It was a touching gesture, I thought, a statement of solidarity from one friend to another at that frantic, frenetic, hectic, stress-filled time of year. The card her friend sent? The front page began: "If they can send a man to the moon ... " The inside concluded: "why can't they send them all there?" That tipped me off that something might be wrong here.

The process of preparing for Pesach is an arduous one, because the prohibition against chametz is unlike all others: Most forbidden foods are always forbidden, and, as a result, are never found in a Jewish home. It takes no special effort to guard a Jewish home from those kinds of forbidden substances. Not so with chametz,

which -- in its more familiar forms of challah, bread, pizza, noodles, cakes, and a million other food products -- is normally permitted and even essential in a Jewish home and a kosher kitchen. For the other 51 weeks of the year, "chametz" is a staple of our diet and the foundation of our kitchen. Thus, the process of "turning the kitchen over" and ridding the entire house of any traces of the chametz that over the course of the year has insinuated itself into our homes and lives is a laborious one. Add young children into the formula and you have a formidable, even daunting challenge.

Preparing for Pesach is a big job, and -- let's be honest -- most of that big job falls upon the woman of the house. As much as we might like to consider ourselves fair-minded or considerate or modern or halachically conscien-

tious (choose the description you like best or that offends you least), the preparations don't seem to be divided evenly or proportionately (when one factors in other responsibilities including outside work, child rearing, etc.).

The following are some thoughts regarding sensitivity, the ability to transcend lethargy, and the human capacity for excuse-making, which is especially active during this season. Most or all of these ideas are probably familiar to you. That's OK; it's a good time for review. As is usually the case, all advanced skills are simply mastery of the basics. Here are the basics; master them.

FOR WOMEN: CLARIFY THE HALACHIC OBLIGATION

First, do what you have to do, but perhaps no more than that. The Talmudic sages were known to refrain from legislating an enactment if they felt that it was a "chumra [stringency] most of the community cannot endure"; in a variation on this theme, Rav Scheinberg, zt"l, identified practices regarding Pesach cleaning that he termed "kulot [leniencies] that most of the community cannot endure." In

other words, halachah is often much more lenient than popular common practice. Find out what the halachah and your communal custom require that you do ... and do that, but not more than that. Most people -- from the noblest of intentions -- adhere to "requirements" that go above and beyond what the halachah actually requires. When weighed

against the exhaustion many women suffer in the lead-up to Pesach that renders them unable to stay awake at the seder, the benefit of taking on chumrot is considerably diminished. In fact, many prominent halachic authorities (including the great 19th Century Torah scholar Rav Naftali Tzvi Yehudah Berlin ("the Netziv") cautioned women against working so hard that they cannot fully participate in the seder experience. Consult your rabbi for halachic guidelines and familiarize yourself with the halachah and your community's minhag.

Delegate:
Enlist the help you need. Some women



embrace martyrdom during this period and end up nursing hurt feelings and resentments rather than expressing a very reasonable request for help.

FOR MEN: DO YOUR PART

Abe goes to see his boss and says, "we're doing some heavy house-cleaning at home tomorrow for Pesach and my wife needs me to help with the attic and the garage, moving and hauling stuff."

"We're short-handed, Abe," the boss replies. "I just can't give you the day off."

"Thanks, boss," says Abe, "I knew I could count on you!"

Do more of the work; pull your weight. There is a Talmudic principle that might apply here: "One fulfills a greater level of mitzvah accomplishment when one participates in the mechanics of performing the mitzvah rather than authorizing an agent to do it on his behalf." The sense of accomplishment in having

a chametz-free home must be earned; it doesn't come for free.

Do your proportionate share of the work, after you factor in your other responsibilities of work outside the home, learning, etc. Agreed: We all have obligations outside the house, and these obligations take up a significant percentage of our time. But the overriding consideration of this season is preparation for Pesach, and you have a stake in that, as well. As with all things, a conversation with your rabbi will give valuable guidance as to how you should allocate your time.

You have a stake in your wife's ability to be present and awake at the Seder. The principle espoused by the Netziv mentioned earlier is your concern, too.

Your recognition of what your wife is doing -- as evidenced by your active involvement and cooperation -- can spare your wife a lot of emotional hurt and feelings of resentment, and preempt shalom bayit issues that sometimes linger in the home long

after the holiday is over.

It is told that a group of halachically meticulous students came to Rav Yisrael Salanter and asked him what halachic stringencies they should observe in the preparation of the matza for the upcoming holiday. Rav Yis-

rael gave them one: "Don't yell at the widows preparing the matza." Matzah-baking was

low-paying seasonal work, and it tended to attract elderly widows trying to supplement their meager incomes. The process of matzah-baking is very stressful -- the clock is ticking, and every second counts -- and tempers can flare and patience can run thin. It wasn't uncommon for people to lose their cool as they urged on the women who did the baking. Matza made in that way lacks a dimension of kedusha, Rav Yisrael taught them. That lesson is relevant to us, as well. If we were to ask Rav Yis-

rael what stringencies to observe in our Pesach preparations today, he would tell us, 'Do your part, and help your wives.'

Express gratitude:

In addition to your own active involvement in the many preparatory processes, express your gratitude to your wife, fully and meaningfully, in both words and actions.

That obligation of gratitude for countless hours of backbreaking work is not discharged by saying a loud, "Feige, thank you!" once. Your wife just spent the better part of the last month getting ready; she deserves something more -- her dignity and your decency demand it. The halachah requires that a man buy his wife a gift before yom tov -- this is true before every holiday, of course, but perhaps the gift that precedes Pesach should be more elaborate, as should the expression of gratitude that accompanies it. The card that comes with the gift is probably more important than the gift. Articulate -- clearly and fully -- as many aspects of your wife's

extraordinary efforts on behalf of her family as you can recognize, and thank her -- sincerely, wholeheartedly -- for each and every one. Celebrate her halachic integrity and devotion to her family. Do that more than once.

FOR CHILDREN: DITTO AND DITTO

Children, too, have an obligation to participate in the preparations for Pesach and expressions of gratitude. The yeshivas give time off weeks in advance -- ostensibly so the kids can help -- and, indeed, they should.

If everyone pulls their weight and acknowledges the herculean efforts of the selfless heroines that make it all happen, we will have happier holidays and happier families. It's the smart thing to do, and it's the right thing to do. Otherwise, we may want to consider an apocalyptic future in which Jewish women commission NASA to begin construction of huge space arks capable of transporting all Jewish men to the moon.■





BEDIKAT CHAMETZ in your car

Bedikat Chametz, the thorough search for chametz we carry out the evening before Pesach, is meant to be performed in all areas in one's possession into which chametz is likely to have been brought during the course of the year. These areas include homes, offices, and even automobiles (other areas may be obligated in Bedikat Chametz, depending on conditions; when in doubt, consult your rabbi). Bedikat Chametz is usually the culmination of days of intensive cleaning to insure that our homes are chametz-free. In this last top-to-bottom search of the house, with candle in hand, every nook and cranny is inspected for overlooked chametz. We even challenge ourselves to be thorough by hiding ten small pieces of chametz – and live in temporary fear that we will forget where we've hidden them. Yet with all this meticulous cleaning and searching, we may overlook the chametz that may be lurking in the car. Cars – whether owned, leased or rented – must be cleaned for Pesach. Even those who don't usually eat in their car must clean and check it because everyone, at some point in time, transports groceries or food products in their car. Additionally, because of the way we use our cars nowadays and the pace at which we live, we often stash and store things in various places in the car as we rush about, and we don't necessarily remember putting them there.

Automobiles present some complicated cleaning challenges because they are designed with lots of small spaces and storage compartments. All these areas must be

clean of chametz before Pesach. Whether you clean your car yourself or have it professionally cleaned, it's important to make sure that the entire car is ready for Pesach.

To help you clean your car properly, OU – Israel's Kashrut Division in conjunction with Auto Center, has compiled a check-list of "cleaning trouble spots" that will require special attention:

- ☐ glove compartments
- ☐ door-side pockets
- ☐ coin compartments
- ☐ seat-back pockets
- ☐ ash trays
- ☐ cup holders
- ☐ interior rugs (shake out and/or vacuum)
- ☐ under the seats
- ☐ between the seat back and seat bottom
- ☐ trunk
- ☐ child car seats
- ☐ seat latch sockets
- ☐ compartments in seats that fold
- ☐ cd compartments

Remember: the car must be checked for chametz the night before Pesach, just as one's home. If, however, the car is overlooked on the night before Pesach, it should be checked the next morning, before the time that chametz is no longer permissible (zman issur chametz). When checking your car for chametz during daytime hours, make sure to check in broad daylight and not in a garage.

Also, remember that after searching you must nullify the chametz in your car just as you do the chametz in your home and office.

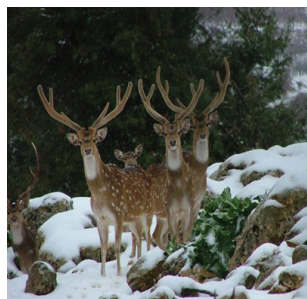

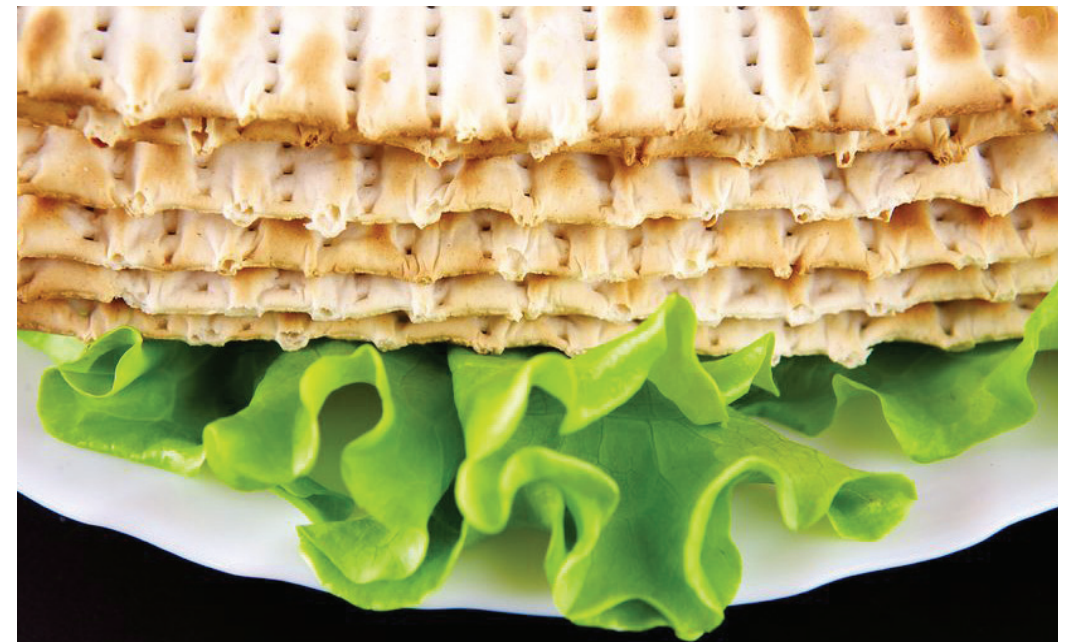

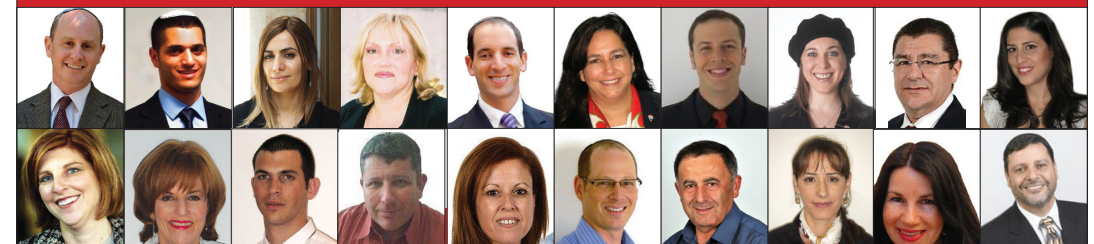

FOOD ROUND-UP:

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

Alcoholic beverages must be certified to be used for Passover. There are numerous issues involving what the alcohol is made from, the equipment it is produced in, and the fermentation process itself. We encourage all kosher consumers to find alcoholic beverages with reliable certification.

BABY RICE CEREALS

Rice is kitniyot, but is permitted for consumption by infants. However, manufactured baby rice cereals can contain actual chametz. Here is a recipe to prepare rice cereal at home:

1. 1/4 cup rice powder (brown or white [not enriched] rice ground in blender, food processor, or coffee grinder).
2. 1 cup water.
3. Bring liquid to boil in saucepan. Add the rice powder while stirring constantly.
4. Simmer covered for 10

minutes, mix in formula or breast milk and fruits if desired.

5. Serve warm.

BOTTLED WATER

All unflavored bottled water is kosher for Passover, even without any kosher supervision.

BROWN SUGAR

Brown sugar often shares tanks with items that contain chametz and therefore requires special Passover certification.

CANOLA OIL

Canola oil, which is a form of rapeseed oil, should be considered kitniyot.

COFFEE

Regular ground coffee: All regular ground coffees are acceptable for Passover use when bearing an U . Decaffeinated coffee: Coffee is often decaffeinated by means of ethyl acetate, which is derived from either kitniyot or chametz.

Therefore, decaffeinated coffees are not acceptable for Passover unless specifically listed in the white or gray pages of this Guide.

INSTANT COFFEE:

Instant coffees often contain maltodextrin, which is derived from either corn (kitniyot) or wheat (chametz). Therefore, all instant coffees require special Passover certification unless explicitly mentioned in the white or gray pages of this Guide.

DAIRY FOODS

Dairy foods are particularly koshersensitive due to the prevalence of enzymes, stabilizers, flavors and vitamins which are made from chametz and kitniyot and are present in most dairy products. Although plain whole, low-fat and skim milk (fresh—not long shelf-life) may be purchased before Passover without special certification, it is proper not to purchase it during Passover unless reliably

certified for Passover. All other dairy products require reliable Passover certification regardless of when they are purchased.

DRIED FRUITS

Dried fruits are usually treated with oils derived from kitniyot and therefore require Passover certification. Extra Virgin Olive Oil All cold-pressed extra virgin olive oils are Kosher for Passover, even without special supervision. All other oils (including pure olive oil) require a reliable kosher certification.

FROZEN FISH

Due to the frequent application of glazes to raw fish, it should be purchased only with reliable kosher supervision.

FROZEN FRUITS AND

Vegetables Frozen vegetables are washed in water that often contains anti-foaming agents, which are not appropriate for

Passover use. Moreover, some companies also pack pasta products on shared packing machinery. Therefore, frozen vegetables require Passover certification. However, these issues are not a concern at facilities that process frozen fruit, which does not require Passover certification. Gluten Allergies Regretfully, because one can only perform the mitzvah of eating matzah at the Seder with a matzah that is made from one of the five

varieties of grain (barley, wheat, rye, oats, and spelt), eating matzot using any of the other flours that are gluten free would still not enable one to fulfill the mitzvah. Some people with the gluten allergy use either oat matzah or spelt matzah. While not completely glutenfree, oat matzah is especially soluble and easy to digest. Those with this allergy should discuss the matter with their allergist and Rabbi. Lakewood Matzoh

Bakery has both hand and machine matzah shmurah, baked under GFCO (Gluten Free Certification Organization) supervision. This matzah is not OU-certified. mitzvah such as eating matzah at the Seder would cause a life-threatening allergic reaction, clearly the mitzvah should not be performed. If the allergic reaction, while severe, would not be life-threatening, ask your Rabbi.

LACTOSE INTOLERANCE

Lactaid production is likely to involve chametz. This renders chewable lactaid tablets problematic. However, our Rabbinical authorities have decided

that lactaid milk is permissible if purchased before Passover since any chametz contained within Lactaid milk would be nullified (batel). Lactaid non-chewable tablets are more complicated. Many Rabbis permit non-chewable vitamins and supplements without regard to their kosher status. According to such opinions, one may take these tablets just like any other non-chewable pill. Other Rabbinical authorities believe that vitamins and supplements are akin to food even when swallowed. According to this opinion one may take the lactaid tablet when wrapped, for example, in tissue paper. However, one who is unable to do that may swallow the tablet without wrapping it, and rely on the lenient authorities, since milk is such an important health need. Ask your Rabbi for guidance.

LEMON JUICE

Lemon juice may be processed on the same equipment as products that contain chametz and kitniyot. Therefore, only those brands listed in the gray pages of this Guide may be used.

MEAT AND POULTRY

All kosher certified raw unprocessed meat and poultry that contain no other ingredients do not require special Passover certification and therefore may be used for Passover. Nuts Raw nuts in their shell do not require Passover certification. Shelled nuts that list BHA or BHT (preservatives) in the ingredients require special Passover certification as they are sprayed on the nuts using corn derivatives (kitniyot).

PEANUTS

There are various customs regarding the use of peanuts and peanut products. Ask your Rabbi if you are unsure. The OU does not certify peanut products for Passover.

QUINOA

There is a difference of opinion among Rabbinic decisors (machloket ha-poskim) as to whether quinoa is considered kitniyot. Ask your Rabbi for his guidance. Additionally, while quinoa is not one of the five grains that can create

chametz (wheat, oat, barley, spelt and rye), and quinoa is not grown in the same vicinity as the grains mentioned above, the processing of quinoa is sometimes done at the same location where they process wheat and wheat flour. It is highly doubtful that the mills are effectively cleaned between grains. The concern of wheat flour or particles finding their way into the quinoa flour would be a serious one.

SALT

Salt that is iodized by means of a corn derivative is kitniyot and therefore iodized salt requires Passover certification. Un-iodized salt does not require Passover certification, nor does sea salt.

SOY MILK

Anyone for whom it is necessary to consume kitniyot may drink these products. However, because we are unable to verify the kosher for Passover status of the equipment on which they are produced, we recommend purchasing these items before Passover, at which point any traces of chametz would be batel

(nullified).

SPICES

Ground spices require Passover certification as they can be processed on equipment that contains chametz and can also be adulterated with kitniyot or chametz.

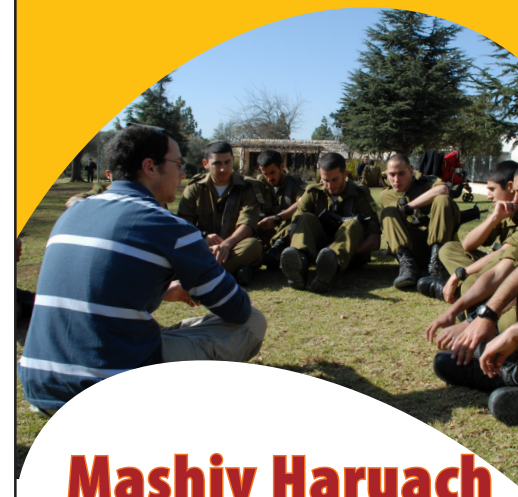
SPLENDA

While the OU does certify Splenda for year-round use, Splenda is not certified Kosher for Pzassover as it contains kitniyot. There is an industrial kosher for Passover Splenda, but it is not available for consumers.

WINE

Please note that not all U kosher wines are certified for Passover use. Some wines, U certified and otherwise, are made with flavorings and colorings to improve the bouquet and the color. Some of these wines do contain kitniyot, and therefore are not marked for Passover use. But the vast majority of U certified wines are U P, and do not contain chametz or kitniyot flavors or sweeteners. Please be sure to check wine labels carefully before purchasing.
